



Hazard Identification Guidelines

When you identify a Potential Hazard located in your area, use Thomas Guide Reference numbers to indicate the area whenever possible.

Some examples of “Potential Hazards” are:

- Bridge
- Water Tanks
- Lake / Reservoir with dam
- Creek or Area subject to flooding
- Gas Stations or Facilities that have hazardous materials
- Overhead Utilities (Power lines)
- Major Underground Utility Lines (Gas, Fuels, Water, etc.) if known to exist.
- Train Tracks
- Buildings that might have many people:
 - Hospital
 - Schools
 - Mall or Large shopping area
 - Office complex (High-rise construction)
 - Sport or Theater complex
 - Churches
 - Fire Stations (for location information)
